North Carolina Central University junior place-kicker **Brandon Gilbert** kicked a career-long 51-yard field goal as time expired to give the Eagles a 17-14 win over Elizabeth City State University in the 2006 Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association Football Championship Game at a capacity O'Kelly-Riddick Stadium in Durham, N.C.

Donating from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA)

The day after someone turns 70 1/2, he can donate up to \$100,000 in what would have been taxable income from an individual retirement account without having to pay tax on that money. The recipient must be a public charity, not a private one such as a family foundation. The gift must be made directly from the IRA to the charity; it may not pass through the account holder's hands, because if it does--even for a second--the money will count as income. Although the donation does not count as taxable income for the year, the money can be counted toward the amount a person must withdraw each year after the age of 70 1/2 from a traditional IRA to avoid penalties.

On November 7th 2006, Frank S. Turner, class of 1968 and a 1973 NCCU law graduate was re-elected to his fourth term in the Maryland Legislature. Frank won re-election by over 10,000 votes, the largest victory of his four election. He beat a Harvard Lawyer in the primary and a George Washington University Lawyer in the general election. Frank's district is only 12 percent minority. Frank will continue as chair of the Personnel Oversight subcommittee and vice chair of the Education and Economic Development subcommittee on the Appropriation Committee.
